

### **Extent and scope:**

The collection consists of audio and video recordings in Ch'ol, a Mayan language spoken in Mexico known to its speakers as *Lakty'añ* and sometimes written as Chol. Many of these audio and video recordings have been transcribed and/or translated into Spanish. Most recordings were made in 2018, though some materials in the collection were recorded in two earlier periods: the 2002 recordings of Carmelino Jiménez by Elmar Martínez and Pedro Gutiérrez and recordings made by Juan Jesús Vázquez in 2007 and 2008.

- 7 MP4 video recordings (totaling 1 hour 45 minutes)

The creation of this collection was funded in part by a National Geographic Explorers grant.

### Access and use conditions:

All collection materials are public access and subject to AILLA's general conditions of use.

### **Processing note:**

AlLLA staff renamed files to replace spaces in file names with underscores, as spaces are not permitted by the repository's software. Question marks in a few file names were deleted. Folders were renamed to create more descriptive titles. Each folder was accompanied by a Microsoft Word document containing metadata for the recording and its participants. These documents were not archived as all of this information is reflected in AILLA catalog information.

### Accruals:

Transcriptions and translations of audio visual recordings are being created and may be added to the collection in the future.
